



16 – 19 Tuition Fund

The purpose of this statement is to set out how Hill Holt Wood is planning to utilise its 16-19 tuition fund allocation for 2021/22 to support students who may have had their learning disrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic

What is the 16-19 tuition fund?

The Education and Skills Funding Agency 16 to 19 tuition fund has been allocated to colleges in 2021/22. The funding is being provided to support small group tuition for 16 to 19 students in English, maths, and other courses where learning has been disrupted.

Hill Holt Wood is committed to using the Tuition Fund that the ESFA has made available, sessions will be limited to no more than 4 students and will take place in addition to the normal planned timetabled activities and support.

Implementation

Hill Holt Wood will use the funding as follows:

- Provide direct tuition, which is additional to the already planned programme of study for 2021-22, within functional skills delivery. The additional learning support ranger timetabled to support will provide small group support in sessions and in particular support students whose assessment was impacted/deferred because of Covid.
- Support will be offered and provided based on the individual needs of each student.

Hill Holt Wood commitment

We are committed to ensuring that the tuition fund is used in accordance with the Government's guidance on the 16 to 19 Tuition Fund by:

- producing this statement setting out how the fund will be used to support the most disadvantaged students.
- publishing this statement on our website.
- recording the use of the fund, including references to individual students who receive support, the needs of those students, the number of hours of tuition delivered and retaining the evidence of the tuition provided.
- delivering the extra tuition and spend the allocated funds in the academic year 2021/22
